<u>Teacher Only Day</u> - thank you to the St Francis community for keeping the children home last Friday. The teachers spent the morning completing their year long mental health and wellbeing professional development through the Mitey Programme, and then spent the afternoon planning in their 2024 teams.

Mental health and wellbeing teaching / learning has been a big focus for St Francis this year, and we are very proud of the steps we have taken towards giving our children age appropriate tools and strategies to discuss their emotions and work through effective ways of dealing with many different scenarios. We will continue with this focus next year, as it is a major aspect of our 2023 - 2025 Strategic Plan.

<u>Thank you</u> - A big thank you to the parents who have been taking the safety of Montrose Street so seriously. We have had a couple of visits from the Auckland Transport Parking Officers lately, thanks to concerned parents (AT are sick of hearing from me\(\epsilon\)!!) Just a reminder:

- U turns near the top of the street are very dangerous as unseen children may be walking on the footpath. It is much safer to turn at the bottom of Montrose.
- Don't park on the yellow lines or block driveways as this makes our neighbours very upset.
- Children should always cross at the crossing.
- To ease congestion consider drop off / pick up on Pt Chev Road or around the corner on Alberta Street or Miller Street. Walking to school (even if it's just a little walk) builds independence, resilience and self confidence.
