renovation parking and H&S - Various tradies and suppliers will require parking in front of the Church during the renovation. Accordingly, an area will be reserved for them and coned off in front of the Church as well as at the Presbytery. We thank you for your understanding and patience. Temporary fencing has been placed around the Church and we ask you to adhere to the H&S notices placed there.

<u>Information from Auckland Transport about continued roadworks in Pt Chev:</u>

General Pt Chev Information:

Next stages for Pt Chev Rd, Meola Rd and Garnet Rd: Our work so far on Meola Road has been significant. The extended road closure period enabled us to make strides in our construction that would have been impossible otherwise, bringing about crucial improvements for the community.

We rebuilt the road from the foundations to stabilise and raise it above the floodplain, undergrounded the power and communication lines, put in new lighting, built new pedestrian crossings, reconstructed vehicle entrances for Seddon Fields and MOTAT, and replaced aging and inadequate stormwater pipes.

The extended closure reduced construction by up to two months (saving up to \$400,000). We rebuilt approximately 1330m of Meola Road, 500m more than the original closure would have allowed, minimising the disruption felt by the community.

We anticipate full completion of Point Chevalier Road, Meola Road and Garnet Road by mid-2025.

April brings new work areas and traffic management changes for the Project on each of our three key roads - Point Chevalier Road, Meola Road and Garnet Road, as well as for some side streets. Please see below.

Point Chevalier Road - detour moves from Monday 15 April: There are currently two work areas on Pt Chevalier Road, one between Walker Road and Meola Road intersections and the other working southward from Formby Avenue and Smale Street intersection.

To accommodate the work area moving south from Smale Street, the traffic management arrangement will change on 15 April 2024, redirecting all northbound traffic off Point Chevalier Road through the side streets of Tui Street, Huia Road and Meola Road - see map below.

 Southbound traffic remains on Point Chevalier Road.



- Traffic lights will be in place at Tui Street intersection to manage traffic flow.
- Walker Road will reopen to Point Chevalier Road, with access southbound only.
- Work is planned across the intersections of Smale Street and Miller Street. When work is underway, access will not be possible out to Point Chevalier Road. Once work is complete in these areas, access southbound will be available.
- Parking is removed in work areas and safety zones.
- Pedestrian access will be limited at times on the western side.
- Vehicle access for residents will be restricted at times. We are working closely with immediate neighbours.

Meola Road - What to expect from Monday 29 April: The current closure on Meola Road will reopen to traffic late on Sunday 28 April 2024. Much more construction remains, and we will be working in stages along the entire length of Meola Road. From Monday 29 April:

- During work hours, Meola Road will be open to traffic with multiple stop-go closures operating Monday to Saturday, 7am to 7pm.
- Outside these times, two-way traffic operates.
- On-road parking will not be available.
- A road closure on Meola Road will be in place between Huia Road and Walford Road from Sunday 28 April, 8pm to August 2024. See below for more detail.
- Traffic lights will be in place at the intersection of Meola Road and Moa Road (24/7) while the Huia Road to Walford Road closure is in place.

Huia Road to Walford Road closure: 28 April to August 2024: The section of Meola Road between Walford Road and Huia Road, currently accessible by residents only, will remain so from late on 28 April through to August 2024.


By closing it for up to three months, we can keep local traffic circulating better between the Point Chevalier Road detours and Meola Road, further reduce congestion on the local road network and lessen disruption to residents within the closure and area.

We will follow up with residents to identify specific concerns, such as residents needing vehicle access for medical, disability or business reasons. Access to driveways will be maintained as best as possible.

Some benefits of the closure:

- Residents will not have to contend with general traffic and construction traffic to get to their homes.
- Residents will be able to access their properties a lot more of the time than otherwise.
- The works for each property can be completed quicker, so there is less disruption overall for each resident.
- More consistent travel times

 and less disrupted travel times
 for road users through the area,
 not just Meola Road. Traffic
 monitoring of real time data
 has shown that diversion routes
 will result in faster and
 consistent overall travel times for general through traffic.



Garnet Road - Works start from Monday 29 April: Work will begin on Garnet Road from the end of April. Initially we will be working on Garnet Road from just south of the roundabout to the intersection of Westmere Crescent. Stop / Go traffic management will be in place to assist the construction team as they carry out drainage work in the berm, footpath and across the road.

The team will be in touch with neighbours shortly ahead of these works with construction details and road changes.

Plan your journey: People should anticipate slower travel times, delays and congestion when passing through the area. We understand that Meola Road is a convenient shortcut for many. Still, we strongly advise against using it and instead travel an alternative route during this construction period. Doing so will help us manage traffic more effectively for locals and ensure the safety of residents and construction workers. At times, residents will have limited access to driveways and there will be no parking available on the road.

Walking, cycling and dog park: Pedestrian and cycle access will be maintained including access to the Meola Reef dog park. Our construction crew will continue to help school children cross the road at temporary crossing points.

Community - thank you: We want to express our gratitude to the community for their patience and ongoing cooperation while works have been carried out. With full completion of Meola Road expected to be achieved in mid-2025, we will be vigilant and keep you updated with our progress.

<u>Information specific to St Francis Catholic School:</u>

After numerous meetings with Auckland Transport regarding parking and roadworks, they have put a few things in place specifically to make our lives a little bit easier:

- Work on Pt Chev is starting at the beginning of the school holidays, so that drop off and pick up at St Francis is affected for the shortest amount of time possible.
- Montrose Street will remain open throughout all of the roadworks, but there will be a left turn ban when leaving back onto Pt Chev Rd as this section will be under traffic light control.
- The traffic management team will ensure safe passage for any pedestrians needing to get across Pt Chev Rd and Montrose Street.
- The traffic management team will attempt to remove the first carparking space/s coming down Montrose Street to improve visibility for right turning traffic and to create more space when turning into Montrose Street, so that we don't block Pt Chev Rd.
- Once the tradies from the building site have finished (only approximately 4 or 5 weeks away), Auckland Transport will look at the option of a "kiss and drop off" area on Montrose Street to move school traffic through quickly to prevent back up on to Pt Chev Rd.
- The traffic management team are going to help out on the days of the Year 4 -6 visit to the Temple and the Year 1 2 trip to the Art Center, as the buses may cause some havoc.

While we are, of course, encouraging our children to walk or cycle to school as much as possible, to reduce the amount of traffic for pick up and drop off, but it is difficult to plan a safe route for walkers / cyclists until we see how these road closures are going to affect the traffic (and driver's attitudes to the changes!!). As soon as we can, we will look at a number of plans for Walking School Bus routes or drop off spots where teachers or volunteers can meet the children e.g. in the big carpark behind KFC, Walmer Reserve, Tui Street, or the Countdown Carpark etc.

Please know that we have spent a lot of time working with Auckland Transport to ensure that the perspective of St Francis Catholic School is considered when they are planning these projects. Just like we have spent a lot of time working with all involved with the building site next door. While these projects have caused / will cause frustration and annoyance, they are necessary for the long term future of our community.
