Mary is even sometimes known as the 'Queen of May', with many images or statues of Mary crowned, sometimes with flowers.

How we celebrate our devotion to Mary in our classroom prayers during May:

- Seniors classes pray a decade of the Rosary a day and learn the accompanying prayers.
- Middle and Juniors classes use the stories from the Rosary Mysteries as their daily Bible stories.
- Middle classes pray a simple Rosary decade with a daily call and response, usually with the teacher to lead.
- Juniors classes do a Hail Mary prayer after their Bible reading.

We held a light to our eyebrow level then wished, wrote it down on a piece of paper, and stuck it on the wall. Their wishes were kind of like how we pray as Christians. We went to the courtyard and did meditation for fifteen minutes, just like at school. We went into a room for a movie, and after the movie a cop came out of nowhere and we talked about temptation and conscience. After that we had delicious fried rice and had some water then got ready to leave. We all said goodbye, we left with a smile on our faces.
