

Parish News - Church Renovation Update: We are hoping the internal painting will start by the end of this week/early next week. Accordingly, we remain on target to finish the reno. by the end of July/August. To keep costs to a minimum, Arvi and Stuart have been pulling favours left, right and centre in getting discounted deals or products provided gratis and conducting working-bees. In this regard, a massive thanks again to Jeremy at Allpro Construction, Julieta of PDL and Dom Hines of Hines Electrical & Security who've really gone beyond in supporting our Parish. We remain within budget with regards to what we planned to do. However, there have been some extras along the way, such as 8 new internal/external doors, new swabs for the pews and extra strengthening/piling work required by the Diocese-recommended engineer, that we are utilising new brick donations for. In addition, we are now thinking that the roof should be painted that will require an additional \$20k that remains unfunded - so a Big call out to those who are able to contribute financially to please do so - the St. Francis Parish renovation bank account number is: 02-0108-0707331-003 and any queries, please contact Stuart. And remember, all donations attract a 33% tax refund.

A summary of the Church renovation costs incurred to date versus our original planned budget is shown below (excluding GST):

A reminder again on how we (the parish, not the school) fund the Church ongoing expenses (salaries of the Parish Secretary and housekeeper - being marginally above the living wage; Father John's salary, being only 30% of the minimum wage; electricity; maintenance; etc.) as well as the Church renovation - in short, we are on our own in that we have to self-fund it, there is no contribution from the Auckland Diocese and Churches are unable to apply for grants for renovating it's Church. Hence, the call-out for the "Buy-the-brick" campaign - refer below. **Church Fundraising - BUY-A-BRICK**: Our Parish Buy-a-Brick campaign remains well underway, with a \$500+ contribution receiving a guaranteed name plaque. Please get in quick as we are going to print with the engravings in the coming week(s). We are very grateful for those who have kindly contributed both
